More than 20 celebrated South African artists will participate in this exciting event. All artworks will be for sale and will be replaced where required as a result of sales.

DIE KRAAL – homage to the work of ceramicist Nicolene Swanepoel

In conjunction with the exhibition *A Tribute to the life and work of JH Pierneef*.

The La Motte Museum launched a special celebrative exhibition for 2017 – A Tribute to the life and work of Jacob Hendrik Pierneef (1886-1957). Celebrating the artist's contribution to South African art and enhancing the museum's permanent heritage collection with selected artworks and personal artefacts from various collections in South Africa. Through this exhibition of over 100 artworks, key aspects and periods are identified to introduce JH Pierneef – the man, the artist and heritage.

During the last months of renowned ceramicist Nicolene Swanepoel's life, she personally engaged with the graphic work of JH Pierneef. This engagement was part of her last (yet unfinished) commission for Pierneef-inspired ceramic plates and cow heads. Die Kraal – homage to the work of ceramicist Nicolene Swanepoel (1962-2016) showcase pieces that documents the various project phases and her technique. Subtle references to the shared inspiration and interest of both Pierneef and Swanepoel can be expected.

A relaxing and rewarding way to spend a few hours is a visit to Leeu Estates, a five-star getaway ensconced in 68 hectares (168 acres) of landscaped gardens, manicured vineyards and indigenous fynbos in the Franschhoek valley, and to take a guided tour of the gardens interspersed with artworks. The tours provide an opportunity to connect with art and nature in serene and meditative spaces with exceptional views.

Analjit Singh, the Leeu Collection's founder, is a keen gardener, and the gardens or 'Leeuscapes' at Leeu Estates have been meticulously designed and landscaped. Art has also been a lifelong interest for Analjit. He personally curated the collection at Leeu Estates, which features predominantly life-sized bronzes by Angus Taylor, Deborah Bell, Dylan Lewis and Otto du Plessis, among other

well-known, mainly South African artists. Each sculpture has been strategically placed between the pristine lawns and rows of hand-tended vines to be shown to its best advantage.

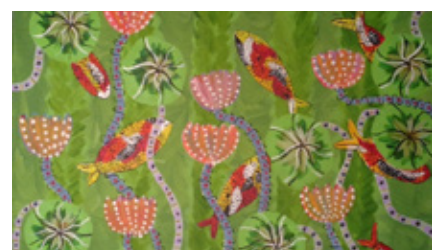

SOLO EXHIBITION | Layziehound Coka | "DREAM CHASERS – slaves to our desires"

Coka's process of creation is borne from an attraction to the "human story", which he translates into powerful, visual works. The metaphoric symbols and imagery used in his work are provocative yet assertive in their approach to the punch lines in each particular piece, which include the use of sweeping lines, graffiti spray text and complementary colours.

PERCEPTIVE RESONANCE: Solo Exhibition by Adriaan Diedericks

Perceptive Resonance is the latest body of work created by Adriaan Diedericks upon his return from carving busts in sandstone at the Fourth International Artist Symposium in Neustadt, Germany in August 2017.

Hinting at Rodin's carved works, the show explores themes of identity, masculinity and the ideal form through an experimental and instinctive methodology which combines classical forms with abstractions. Jutting sharp edges are contrasted with smooth surfaces of the human form.

Adriaan Diedericks (b. 1990, Cape Town) is a South African sculptor based in Strand, Cape Town. He grew up in rural Piketberg and his upbringing there has had a great impact on his work. After graduating with a degree in Fine Art from Stellenbosch University in 2012, he completed an apprenticeship with Lionel Smit from 2012 until the end of 2014. He has exhibited extensively in group exhibitions, this will be his sixth solo exhibition.

His work can be found in private collections around the world – New York, Netherlands, France, Switzerland, Holland, Los Angeles, Australia, Las Vegas, Italy, Belgium, Germany, London, Canada, South Africa and Barbados.

The exhibition runs from 21 October to 16 November 2017. Opening event: 11:00 Saturday 21 October. Sunday 29 October: Artist Walk-About with Adriaan Diedericks 13:00 and a Live Casting Demonstration 15:00.

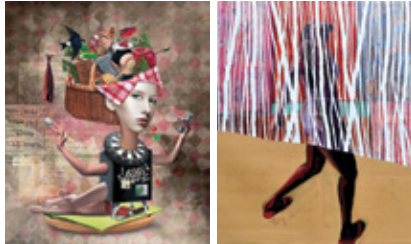

ERIK LAUBSCHER - 'THE LANDSCAPES'

Opening Saturday 27th October 2017 at 11:00. Exhibition continues until Sunday 7th January 2018.

A selection of paintings from 1946-2012. This major exhibition focuses on one of South Africa's finest abstract artists and his recurring examination of the South African landscape. Drawing on works over a 50 year period, 'The Landscapes' will exhibit works which have never been seen before and will include large scale, finished oils and smaller preparatory sketches and drawings.

Erik Laubscher's career is well documented - from his early years at Michaelis School of Fine Art in Cape Town in the 1940's to his studies in London and Paris and his inclusions in the Sao Paulo and Venice Biennales. Laubscher described the challenge he set himself as "creating the illusion of the landscape having continuing vastness and the painting being part of the whole, instead of something complete and contained".

IAN GARRETT - 'BEHIND THE LINES'

Opening Saturday 27th October at 12:00. Exhibition will continue until Nov 26th.

Considered one of South Africa's foremost living ceramicists, Ian Garrett's masterful work has grown out of a life-long fascination with the primordial ceramic technology of hand-building, burnishing and pit-firing. Informed by an expert knowledge of archaic traditions, Garrett's nuanced, hybrid vessels appear both timeless and strikingly contemporary.

Original forms and highly refined, intricate surfaces characterise Garrett's oeuvre, with glossy burnished areas contrasted against elaborate swathes of matt-textured linear motifs. Suggesting finger-prints, cartographic contours or magnetic force-fields, these lines appear to make visible hidden energies within the clay fabric.

The work on exhibition follows Garrett's award of a prestigious Smithsonian Artist Research Fellowship in 2016. New colours are introduced, along with an increasingly sophisticated exploration of symmetry and pattern composition.

Gerick Terblanche is a self-taught artist with a background in Industrial design. He admits to being obsessed with nature and uses it as subject matter. He believes that there is both a spiritual and emotional gain in nurturing our relationship with nature and that the power of the natural environment is not to be under-estimated.

Terblanche's beautifully detailed paintings on canvas place wildlife in a contemporary setting reflecting on our relationship with the natural world. Elements of Ndebele Culture such as decoration, simple pattern work, texture and colour all relate and influence his work.

This is his first solo exhibition at Ebony following sell out shows in Cape Town.
